A fundamental premise of most life span theories is that development over the life course involves adaptation to the normative and non-normative events encountered over one's lifetime . immigration is a profound non-normative life transition, requiring extensive adaptation. After immigration many persons experience psychological stressors that mimic aspects of post traumatic stress disorder. The terminology used to describe this experience is post migration distress.
